

DEPARTMENT OF ART HISTORY

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ABOUT US:

The study of art history has been continually implemented since the establishment of Zadar Faculty of Philosophy in 1954. Until recently (the establishment of the art history study at the University of Rijeka and Split), this department has been, together with one in Zagreb, the only art history department in Croatia. Throughout its existence, at first within the Faculty of philosophy, and later the University of Zadar, this study has gained reputation of the centre where some of the most excellent scholars were educated, have taught and researched. Their scientific achievements during last few decades have significantly improved Croatian art history regarding various periods of mainly Dalmatian cultural heritage: from early-Christian to contemporary art. They have also taken an important role in creating the core of the cultural historical researchers together with colleagues from the other departments within the University, but also those from the Institute of historical sciences of Croatian Academy of Sciences and Arts in Zadar, State Archive, People's and Archaeological Museum in Zadar, as well as the other relevant institutions settled in Dalmatia. In addition, this study has educated generations of art historians who persistently worked on the cultural enlightenment of society as high school teachers, museum curators, journalists, etc.

Since there is a high concentration of cultural monuments and artefacts in Zadar and its region, each student has an opportunity of a direct visual communication with the basic subject of the art history study: artistic expression. This advantage has always been broadened with the obligatory field work which takes place in the Croatian and European cities.

The aim of the art history study at the University of Zadar is to educate qualified and skilled art historians who will work in the numerous public and private institutions which have needs for the specific profile of art and culture historian (i.e. research institutes, museums, galleries, secondary school system, tourist companies, etc.).

The curriculum of the Art history department at the University of Zadar is compatible with those at Zagreb and Rijeka universities, and with the curricula “Storia delle arti e conversazione dei beni artistici” of the Cà Foscari university in Venice, “Storia dei beni artistici” of Università degli Studi di Firenze, Dipartimento di Architettura, Urbanistica e Rilevamento of Università di Padova and the Oddelek za umetnostno zgodovino Filozofske fakultete Univerze v Ljubljani. Therefore, our curriculum is fully compatible and opened to

the horizontal fluctuation of lecturers and students who will be able to temporarily or permanently sojourn on any of the European universities of which majority of the art history departments implement compatible curricula. Simultaneously, through its openness and implemented ECTS system, this curriculum enables fluctuation of students within the resident university, i.e. other departments.

STUDY PROGRAMMES

Undergraduate university study programme of Art History **(double-major)**

Duration of the study: 6 semesters

Admission requirements: Secondary education and certificate of passed matriculation exam.

- to recognize and interpret basic terms and categories in art history
- to classify material into descriptive categories
- to analyse and critically interpret phenomena and works of visual arts and architecture and to clearly draw conclusions by use of the basic postulates of art-historical methodology and classification

Upon completion of the undergraduate study program in History of Art (single-major) students acquire the following competences:

- of interpreting basic terms and categories in art history, as well as those of general nature that are related to the cultural history on a national and international level
- of describing, interlinking and interpreting transformational processes as determined by the traditional art-historical narrative
- to analyse and critically interpret individual works and phenomena of art and architecture
- to recognize the importance of historical context of particular phenomena of art and architecture, and to determine, distinguish and compare elementary features of respective style periods
- to clearly classify knowledge into descriptive categories
- to apply all the elementary methodological concepts of art history into interpretation and presentation of common art-historical questions

Upon completion of the graduate study program in History of Art (Museums and Conservation module) (single-major) students acquire the following competences:

- of use and interpretation of art history as a scholar and culturological discipline
- of description and critical judgement of the theoretical approaches to artistic and architectural heritage by recognizing and applying the most relevant scholar interpretative methods of the art history
- of valorisation and critical writing on phenomena of art history, architectural and artistic production in the context of history of culture and art-historical narrative
- to classify and explain crucial historical concepts of conservation, its most important protagonists and projects and to interpret and use the principles and rules of the conservation and restoration of both mobile and immobile heritage; to critically judge the basic theories, professional rules and procedures of the preventive protection of cultural heritage; to apply basic professional terminology; identify and classify materials as well as variety of damages and their causes
- to categorize and interpret key levels of historical, theoretical and practical museology; interpret and critically judge the historical and contemporary aspects of national and international museological institutions, organization of museum activities, as well as to interpret, construct and present the museological, pedagogical/andragogical, promotional and publishing activities of a museum
