## About us:

The Department of Hispanic and Iberian Studies started as a Sub-department within the Department of French Language and Literature in 2007/2008, and today it is an independent Department running three study programs:

- The undergraduate university study of Spanish language and literature - from year 2007/2008.
- University master study of Hispanics (general) - from 2013/2014.
- University master study of Hispanics (translation) - from 2013/2014.

The main purpose of the Department of Hispanic and Iberian Studies is to enable students to gain insight into the linguistic and cultural wealth of Spain and the entire Pyrenees Peninsula as well as Latin American space within one study program. Undergraduate study of Spanish language and literature is intended for students without prior knowledge of Spanish. With the adoption of Spanish as a foreign language, students also adopt another Romance language, which can be Galician and Catalan. In addition to linguistic and literary courses, students gain knowledge of Hispanic and Latin American history, culture and civilization. The level of knowledge of the Spanish language B2-C1 after undergraduate and C1-C2 after graduation is expected, while the level of knowledge of other Romani languages B2-C1 is expected.

“There are different people and their different speeches” wrote a great Catalan poet Salvador Espriu in his collection of *La pell de brau* (Bull's skin). Under bull, Espriu's was thinking of Spain, which in his verse is called Sepharad, as he was called by some of his expelled sons, Spain, who at that time lived under a dictatorship that would erase any differences. But Spain and Latin America are the areas of diversity that speak a lot of languages. According to the latest data, more than two hundred languages are spoken in Barcelona, and will not be different in Madrid or Valencia. From these languages to the undergraduate study of Spanish Language and Literature at the University of Zadar you can study three: Spanish as mandatory language, and then through a large number of elective courses Catalan, Galician and Basque.

In this way, all Iberian languages, the University of Zadar, is part of a small, but prominent group of European universities (Basel, Liverpool, Padua, Paris III-Sorbonne Nouvelle, Tübingen, Venezia and others) where Iberian studies exist. Their main goal is to enable students

to gain a complete insight into the linguistic and cultural richness of a study program, primarily in Spain, and then in the entire Pyrenees peninsula and Latin American space. By opting for this study, you will be able to learn these languages, but also learn basic information about the other languages of the Pyrenees Peninsula - Asturian, Aragonese, Aran, and Basque. You will also know the differences that appear in these languages, the coexistence and conflicts that arise from their mutual intercourse, the literatures that have arisen in these languages, both in the Pyrenean Peninsula and in the American continent. But first, you will learn to speak, understand, write and read these languages, or communicate on them, which, in the end, is what the languages should serve.

People who make their language skills feel at home almost in every corner of the Pyrenees Peninsula and Latin America are extremely rare: be one of them.
