Description of the course	<p><b>Course content</b></p> <p>Today we live in the world saturated with images. From art, cinema, TV, commercial billboards to video games, social networking services, comic books etc., images make effects on our ideas about the social. This course will investigate the role of cultural production and visual practices (photography, film, games, comic books) by introducing students to key debates on ways of seeing, aesthetics, ideology, manufacturing desire, consumerism, identity questions (race, gender, sexuality, age) and citizenship. It will also discuss the role of visual in anthropological research.</p> <p><b>Assessment Criteria &amp; Mode of Examination</b></p> <p><b>Weekly assignment (30%).</b> In order for the course to be effective, all students must have the reading assignments completed for each class . Each week students will do homework based on their reading assignments. Each week students will upload to the course website their weekly homework. <b>Late weekly homework</b> will earn a reduced grade!</p> <p><b>Research project and final paper (70%).</b> (visual essay 50% + oral presentation 20%). Visual Essay to be submitted by February 20, 2020. In addition to the essay, students need to submit an abstract of their project (roughly 1 page) by January 5, 2020. Presentation should last 15 minutes. It will be graded on (1) the originality of the topic and its interpretation in connection with one or more theories assigned for this course (2) clearly developed argument (3) the organization of the presentation and the quality of the delivery,</p>
