From the earliest iconographic evidence, to the sophisticated vessels of the post-mediaeval period, it provides an overview of the ships that were used through ages in the complex Mediterranean environment. The special attention is paid to the evolution of the ancient Greek, Hellenistic and Roman merchantmen and warships, in the form of galleys and sailing ships. The examples of the Athenian trireme, the gigantic ships of the Late Hellenistic Age, or the Roman liburna and Byzantine dromon give us the idea of the present state of research on the specific ships' types for which we still lack the archaeological evidence. On the other hand, a number of researched shipwrecks from Greek and Roman period helped us to increase our knowledge on the ancient merchant fleets. The infrastructure needed for the efficient seafaring includes various types of ports, what makes them an inevitable part of the study of ancient seamanship.
