| Description of the course | The course provides insight in the history of research on language contact; kinds of language contact; basic characteristics of the borrowing processes; basic settings and features of bilingualism and multilingualism; the basic characteristics in the adaptation and integration of transferonyms (loanwords) at different linguistic levels (orthographic, phonological, morphological and semantic) and the basic theoretical and practical (lexicographic) solutions and approaches to the study of language contact (mostly) on examples of contacts between English and Croatian. | | |
| | Upon graduation, students will be able to: define and explain the basic terms and concepts of contact linguistics; specify the basic types of contact situations (maintenance, shift, creation); understand the social context of language contact; understand the difference between bilingualism and multilingualism, as well as between bilingual and monolingual speaker; to describe and understand the procedures and products of lexical borrowing; to understand and to describe the adaptation of loanwords on orthographic, phonological, morphological and semantic levels; understand the structural effects in the process of lexical borrowing; understand and to interpret the differences in adaptation of loanwords on different linguistic levels; know the difference between different types of loanwords at the semantic level; understand, to use and interpret the symbols and indices used in explaining the adaptation transferonyms (loanwords) in various specific dictionaries and to use different lexicographic solutions and methodological procedures in the description of adaptation; independently conduct a small research (seminar) work in the field of contact linguistics; independently write an essay on a given topic; manage to solve a simple research problem individually; independently write some homework assignments on given topics. | | |
