Description of the course	<p>The course focuses on different dimensions of sexuality, with the aim of understanding sexuality as a multidisciplinary phenomenon. Emphasis will be placed on the historical, cultural and biological aspects of sexuality. The course will cover topics such as controversies and differences in sexuality throughout history and across cultures. Several theoretical approaches and ways of exploring human sexuality will be addressed. Then, topics related to the basics of the anatomy and physiology of the reproductive organs will come into focus. Furthermore, various models will be presented to explain the sexual response, their similarities and differences. Finally, attention will be focused on birth control methods and risky sexual behaviors.</p>
