

USEFUL INFORMATION IN SZCZECIN**PUBLIC TRANSPORT**

In Szczecin, price of a ticket depends on the period of time it is valid. When you punch the ticket, the puncher places a current time on it. You can change means of transport as many time as you want, but when the ticket expires - you have to punch another one.

120 mins / 5.00 PLN /

1 PLN equals to around 0.25 - 0.30 EURO



Call for CULT-COOP: 2017

Draft: The research will aim at providing a comprehensive framework for the risk assessment and preservation of European coastal and maritime cultural landscapes. It should be geographically balanced and cover different types of European coastal and maritime cultural landscapes taking into account various historical backgrounds and the current state of these regions, as they range from the most popular destinations of mass tourism to the most peripheral regions of Europe. The research - multidisciplinary to the extent required by its inherent and explicit research approach - might combine approaches and methodologies of cultural heritage preservation, social sciences and humanities and environmental sciences. It will cover both tangible and related intangible cultural heritage in order to provide a full picture of the societal importance of the cultural heritage of the landscapes under investigation.
