Course description	Through this course students achieve high standards in all skills (level C2). Students further develop their reading skills by analysing different authentic texts. They write summaries, essays, etc., thus further developing their writing skills. Students improve their speaking skills and are encouraged to develop their critical thinking. Furthermore, students enrich their vocabulary (idioms, collocations, phrasal verbs) and develop their translation competence. By doing translation exercises, students revise and use complex grammatical structures.
